



Accessing e-journals: LexisLibrary

Step 1

Go to the Electronic Journals A-to-Z at: <http://atoz.ebsco.com/Home.asp?id=1710>
(You can also find links to the A-to-Z within Blackboard and the University Portal.)

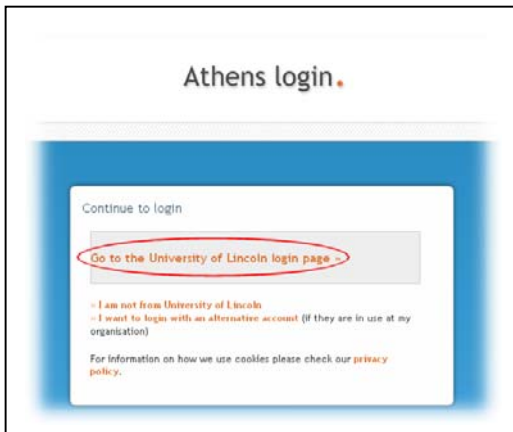
Step 2

Click on the 'Log in' tab.



Step 3

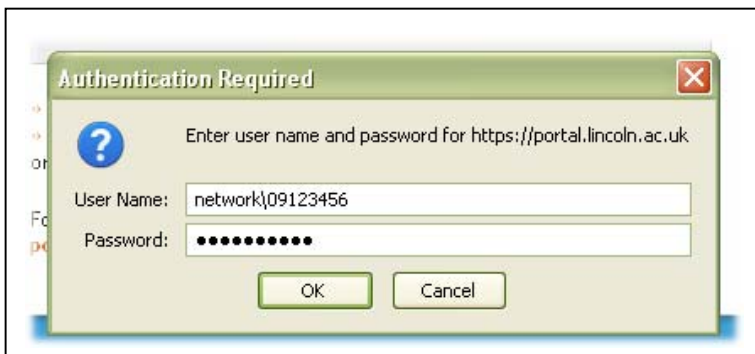
You will be taken to an 'Athens login' page.
Click on the link to 'Go to the University of Lincoln login page'.



Step 4 – if you are off campus (otherwise go to step 5)

You will see a pop-up login box. Log in using your University login details in the format:

- User Name: **network\accountID** — e.g. network\09123456
- Password: your usual, University computer password




Step 5

You will be taken back to the A-to-Z home page.
Type the name of the journal into the search box and hit 'Go'.
As an example, we have used the journal: *Air Force Law Review*.



Step 6

Within the search results, locate the correct journal.
Underneath the journal title, click on the link to 'LexisNexis LexisLibrary'.




Step 7

A new window will open, and you should see the LexisLibrary page for the journal.
Toward the right hand side of the page, click on the link to 'Academic Sign-In'.



Step 8

Click on 'Athens Sign-in'.


